- Need to continue to work on issues such as housing and VSB
- Rethink the way we are consulting, need more feedback from Board members
- COV has verbally agreed that PDC will be at the table therefore need to hire another consultant for the next phases
- Look at development permit process
- Cynthia recommends hosting a housing discussion to look at what Council has passed and be prepared to send new information from our community – recommends hosting at the end of November 2018

Youth Incentive Program

- Brief handed out during meeting
- Was a successful youth leadership and development program that was at Britannia from 2003 2011
- Youth from the community were provided incentives and opportunities to engage their community, develop life skills, gain skills and experience that benefited their resumes and take ownership of their role at the community centre and community
- Funding was lost 8yrs ago and over the past year
- youth team have been meeting to redefine and recommit to key values, principles and objectives for youth services here at Britannia. YIP has been identified as a program that has not been replaced by anything similar and the outcomes and objectives were still relevant and much needed
- YIP achieves the following;
 - Recognizes the value of youth in centre programs and creating space for them;
 - Empowers and legitimizes youth for their voice and their input into the community;

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Creates a pool of community youth with the skills and ability to help fill some of the needed roles, and;

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- Develop a pool of employable community individuals for our expansion over the next 10 years.
- Recommendation will be brought to the Finance and Executive Committee, that the Board direct staff to budget \$30,000 annually towards a Britannia Youth Incentive Program, if necessary management will pursue grant funding.
