

Britannia Artist Grant 2020 Information Sheet

The Britannia Artist Grant was created to assist Community Artists with their artistic pursuits and goals. Projects are expected to be showcased within the Britannia catchment of Grandview Woodland and Strathcona.

Please apply for one of the three categories.

1. **Emerging Artist:** \$1,000 grant: Artists who are in the early stages of their creative development; Artists, collectives or ensembles who have a focused direction and goals, even while still developing their artistic “voice”. Project expected to be showcased within the Britannia catchment. *Note: no community engagement component required.
2. **Performing Arts:** \$1,000 grant: May include song, dance, music, opera, theatre and musical theatre, magic, illusion, mime, spoken word, puppetry, circus arts and performance art. Must include community engagement and be showcased within the Britannia catchment with live performance(s).
3. **Visual Arts:** \$1,000 grant: May include multimedia, fibre arts, culinary arts, ceramics, drawing, painting, sculpture, printmaking, design, photography, video and film-making. Must include community engagement and be showcased within the Britannia catchment.

Requirements:

- Complete contact info including: home/studio address, phone number & email address
- Artist biography and project summary (no more than 400 words)
- 3-5 jpeg images
- Applicants must include an itemized list of how they would spend the grant money if awarded
- Community relationships involved in the project and how they have been developed
- How the completed work will be displayed and/or shown and where, site specifications, if any
- Size(s) of work, if applicable.
- The grant funding is solely meant for 'artists' (in their disciplines) and not for organizations, non-profit or otherwise
- Cannot apply if you have been awarded this grant in a previous year
- Applicants must work or live in the Grandview-Woodland or Strathcona Communities (Grandview Woodland boundaries are Broadway to Burrard Inlet and Clark Drive to Nanaimo) (Strathcona boundaries are Terminal Ave to Burrard Inlet and Main Street to Clark Drive)
- The successful recipients provide a copy and/or documentation of the work upon completion
- All winners will be invited to the Arts and Culture Committee meeting in January 2021, to report on how they spent their grant funding, which will include a brief 5 minute presentation by each grant winner
