CAPC (Community Action Program for Children) is funded by the Public Health Agency of Canada for local community-based organizations to support families with young children under age six. In B.C., CAPC programs are organized into regional coalitions, and Britannia is part of one.

The **Children Need Care Now CAPC Coalition** consists of Britannia Community Services Centre, Britannia Community Education and Strathcona Community Centre.



We organize programs and activities throughout the year, focusing on:

- Healthy child development and early learning, such as Parent Child Mother Goose (Spanish and Chinese), School's Cool, First Steps to Learning and Learning Through Play
- Adult education such as ESL, parenting, nutrition, First Aid, Food Safe
- Food security programs including food coupons, groceries, community kitchens
- Wellness for parents: exercise and yoga classes, arts and crafts, workshops, cultural celebrations
- Annual parents conference
- Annual Inner City Pumpkin Patch

Programs are delivered in several languages:

- Cantonese, Vietnamese, Spanish, English
